SECTION 4: FIRST-AID MEASURES

Inhalation	Remove the casualty to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. If breathing has stopped, give artificial respiration. Obtain medical attention.

SECTION 5: FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

Suitable Extinguishing Media	Flood with water. Do NOT use dry chemical, foam or CO2 on the material itself. Do not use a small amount of water — this may accelerate decomposition.
Unsuitable Extinguishing Media	High-pressure water jet.
Specific Hazards	Strong oxidiser: contact with combustible material may cause fire. Decomposition may release chlorine or oxygen, intensifying combustion. Fight the fire from a protected distance.
Advice for Fire-fighters	Wear self-contained breathing apparatus and full protective clothing. Prevent fire-fighting water entering drains or watercourses.

Personal Precautions	Evacuate unnecessary personnel. Ensure adequate ventilation. Wear the personal protective equipment described in Section 8. Eliminate all ignition sources where the product is flammable.
Environmental Precautions	Prevent entry into drains, sewers, surface water and groundwater. Notify the relevant authorities if release to the environment occurs.
Containment & Cleaning	Contain the spill with an inert absorbent (dry sand, earth or vermiculite). Collect into a labelled, closed container for disposal. Do not use combustible absorbents such as sawdust where the product is an oxidiser. Ventilate the area and wash the spill site after material pick-up.

Precautions for Handling	Use only in well-ventilated areas. Avoid contact with skin, eyes and clothing. Avoid the formation and inhalation of dust, mist or vapour. Do not eat, drink or smoke in the work area. Wash thoroughly after handling.
Conditions for Storage	Store in the original, tightly closed container in a cool, dry, well-ventilated place away from direct sunlight and heat. Keep away from incompatible materials listed in Section 10. Store in a bonded area where liquids are held.
Packaging Materials	Use only the original packaging or an equivalent material approved for this product.
